On Sunday October 21, 1973 The First  
 Bethany U.C.C. in St. Clair Shores (22707 Harmon  
 St.) will celebrate the rededication of their  
 newly remodeled Sanctuary and the dedication  
 of a newly constructed Fellowship Hall.  
 The congregation and friends will assemble  
 at 10:30 AM for a worship celebration with  
 the Rev. Mr. Wm. Daniels, Minister of the  
 Detroit Metropolitan Association U.C.C. as  
 the Principle Speaker. The Rev. Arnold R. Padgett  
 Minister of First-Bethany since its beginning in 1953  
 and its coming to the Shores in January 17, 1954,  
 will conduct the celebration services. Mr. George  
 Lopez, the President of First-Bethany will also  
 take part in the services as will Mr. Irving  
 Winkler, <sup>a member of First-Bethany,</sup> and <sup>as well as Mr. Irving</sup> the architect and builder of the new <sup>Winkler</sup> Fellowship Hall, <sup>with seating capacity of 210.</sup>

The remodeling of the Sanctuary was designed  
 by Mr. Paul Berry, <sup>a member of the congregation,</sup> owner of Byron Interiors, Detroit  
 The remodeled Sanctuary has a complete new  
 altar and pulpit arrangement with new choir pews  
 and pews for the congregation. The Interior is  
 finished and makes use of stone work designs.  
 Also during the summer, the parking lot  
 was <sup>enclosed</sup> black topped with spaces for 105 cars.  
 This work was done by Sauler Construction Detroit.  
 A <sup>2<sup>nd</sup></sup> garage was also built adjacent to the passage  
 by the Miller Garage Builders, Detroit.
